


## Join us as we encounter the boondocks of the Corbally

Explore the mysterious flat waters beyond the infamous Obstruction and be welcomed into Corbally Harbour, where the friendly natives will greet you with suitable refreshments, before you have to head back to civilization.

**The Corbally Branch** is 7.25 km long, starting at Naas harbour and ending at Corbally harbour. It was originally used to transport malting barley to Reeves Mill at Athgarvan. It has been blocked to large boats since 1954 by a low culvert [The Obstruction] near Jigginstown. Its waters feed the Naas Line. The large boats will have to moor east of The Obstruction, but those in canoes, kayaks and dinghies will proceed up the line.

The Kildare branch of the IWAI is campaigning to have the culvert replaced with a road bridge with sufficient air draft to enable the passage of boat traffic once again into Corbally harbour. This we hope to achieve in tandem with improvements to facilities in Naas Canal harbour and on the Corbally branch itself.
