Yachtsmen and Seafarers*

Cable Repair at KP35 on Celtic Interconnector Project, Celtic Sea

1. Notice of Activity

The Department of Transport has been notified by Nexans that they will perform cable repair operations for the Celtic Interconnector Designated Activity Company (CIDAC) as part of the Celtic Interconnector Project. The vessel will arrive in the area on or around **23 March 2026**. The duration of the operation will be **25 days** subject to weather conditions and operational constraints.

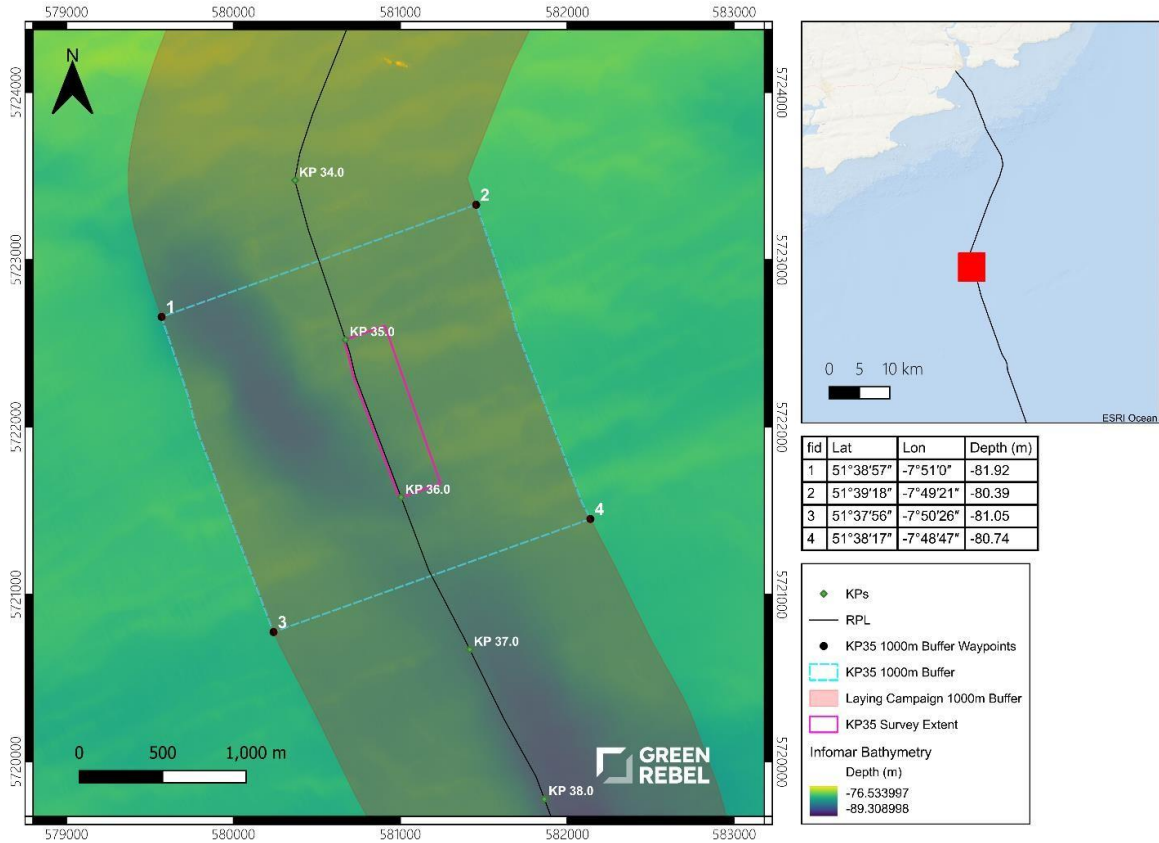
2. Location of Activity

The repair operations will be conducted within waypoints provided in Table 1 and displayed in Figure 1 below:

3. Details of Vessel

The operations will be carried out by the vessel **“Nexans Aurora” (Call Sign: LALC8)**.

During the repair operations the vessel will keep a listening watch on VHF Channel 16 and will actively transmit on AIS signal. A listening watch will also be maintained on other relevant VHF Channels as appropriate.
